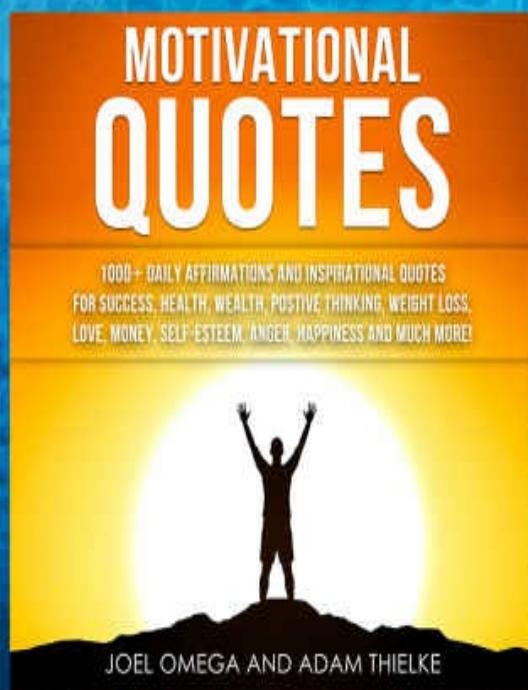

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Butterflies cannot fly if their body temperature is less than 86 degrees.
